## Jannine's organic baby store turns ten

Jannine Barron has grown her business like a healthy baby and her 'child' is about to turn 10. Jannine's story is literally one of rags to riches, which started with twenty dollars and a piece of cloth. 'I was on a parenting benefit,' says Jannine. 'I had been travelling before I got pregnant so had no resources behind me.

'My life was primarily as a volunteer and I funded my travels with teaching, media and human rights administration work. I always did what I loved whether it paid me or not. I remember having \$20 that I could spare to buy some fabric. I had to wait until the next fortnight to buy more'.

Jannine wanted to be able to work from home to look after her own toddlers and she first off to school so she opened a parents to enjoy organic, earthopened the doors of Australia's first organic baby store in her garage in July 2000. She sold to local Byron Bay parents and her hours were from noon to 5pm one day a week.

She also began to sell her organic products online. 'I developed an online niche business,' says Jannine. 'We had about ten sales a week. Every sale online is still exciting, even after all these years.


